

Employees can be exposed to cold temperatures when working outside during winter weather or indoors in refrigerated or freezer areas. Extremely cold or wet conditions are dangerous situations that can cause occupational illness and injuries such as frostbite, hypothermia, and death.

Safety Tips for Workers

Know the symptoms of cold stress. Monitor your physical condition and that of your coworkers. Dress appropriately for the cold. Stay dry because moisture or dampness, e.g., from sweating, can increase the rate of heat loss from the body. Keep extra clothing (including underwear) handy in case you get wet and need to change. Drink warm fluids (no alcohol). Use proper engineering controls, safe work practices, and personal protective equipment provided by your employer.
